Achievements 2018



Held an informational event for doctors on the health impacts of EMFs with Michael Neuert; created new brochure: What are EMF's?; created new handout on cell phone radiation effects on children; circulated Shelly Masters 5G artwork; call to action alert to stop 5G Senate Bill S.3157; opposed Verizon "small cell" application in Sebastopol; launched EMF Health Effects Survey; Website, email and phone support for 5G, smart meter and EMF opposition with local, state and nationwide activists and for EMF injured.

Distributed 2000 What are EMF's? brochures, Engaged attorney Gail Karish from Best Best and Krieger to write a letter on how to legally oppose 5G. Circulated letter to help other cities; Verizon withdrew application for small cells in Sebastopol, Won Constant Contact All-Star Award for high open and click rates.

EMFSN website added 15 new posts and a new webpage on How to Oppose 5G. Constant Contact added 746 sign-ups, for a total of 3546 contacts. Facebook added 312 followers (total 2188) and Twitter added 117 followers (total 1787).

Co-coordinated \$10K flow fund grant with Ecological Options Network to include support to the following groups: Cellular Phone Task Force, Halt MA smart meters, New York Safe Utility Meter Association, Manhattan Neighbors for Safer Telecommunications, and Electronic Silent Spring.
